BUSHFIRE

Regional Tourism Bushfire Recovery Grants

The Regional Tourism Bushfire Recovery Grants program will have two funding streams which, together, will support events, concerts, festivals and visitor attractions in fire affected regions to assist with recovery efforts and encourage international and domestic visitors to come back to the regions.

Stream 1 applicants will be local government authorities and regional tourism organisations operating in local government areas with activated state government Disaster Recovery Funding Arrangements (DRFA) for the 2019-2020 fire season. These entities are listed in Annexure A in the guidelines. **Closing date: November 20, 2020**

Stream 2 applicants are local government authorities and regional tourism organisations in local government areas activated by state or territory governments for DFRA assistance during the 2019-20 fire season **and** which are declared Category D. The eligible entities for this stream are listed in Annexure B to the guidelines.

Closing date: March 20, 2020

[Bushfire Recovery Round of Regional Events Fund](#)

The Victorian Government Bushfire Recovery Round of Regional Events Fund is targeted towards helping kick-start the recovery of regions affected by the summer's bushfires.

Events must take place within the following local government areas: Ararat, Alpine, Ballarat, East Gippsland, Glenelg, Golden Plains, Greater Bendigo, Indigo, Mansfield, Moyne, Northern Grampians, Pyrenees, Southern Grampians, Strathbogie, Towong, Wangaratta, Wellington and Wodonga and the Alpine Resorts of Mount Buller, Mount Hotham, Mount Stirling and Falls Creek.

[2020 Australian Cultural Diplomacy Grants Program \(ACDGP\): Bushfire Renewal Round](#)

The 2020 Australian Cultural Diplomacy Grants Program (ACDGP): Bushfire Renewal Round will focus on supporting the building, rebuilding and promotion of the creative industries in bushfire-affected areas of Australia.

Closing date: March 16, 2020

[Landcare Australia Bushfire Recovery Grants](#)

The Landcare Australia Bushfire recovery grants 2020 program will support landcare and community environment groups as well as networks in bushfire affected areas. The grants support the urgent needs of landcare communities to restore essential wildlife habitat, shelterbelts and fences, protect waterways, manage weeds and feral animals, work with Traditional Owner groups and run local community workshops, among other recovery activities. Grants of up to \$15,000 (excluding GST) are available.

Closing date: March 13, 2020

SCIENCE

[The Prime Minister's Prizes for Science – Science Prizes](#)

The Prime Minister's Prizes for Science are an element of the Inspiring Australia - Science Engagement Programme. The prizes will award up to \$750,000 each year for outstanding achievements in science, research-based innovation and excellence in science teaching.

Closing date: March 12, 2020

There are two Science Teaching Prizes:

- Prime Minister's Prize for Excellence in Science Teaching in Primary Schools (\$50,000)
- Prime Minister's Prize for Excellence in Science Teaching in Secondary Schools (\$50,000).

[Cooperative Research Centres Projects \(CRC-P\) Grants - Round 9](#)

The Cooperative Research Centres Program supports industry-led collaborations between industry, researchers and the community. The grants range from \$100,000 to \$3 million.

Early Intervention grants are to:

- contribute to the preservation of the safety of Australians through funding

local crime prevention activities that address anti-social behaviour and/or racial or religious intolerance by at-risk youth

- help at-risk marginalised young people aged 12 to 25 to develop life skills to prevent them from becoming entrenched in the criminal justice system and to promote inclusion and build community resilience

Grants available are between \$200,000 and \$3,000,000. The grant amount will be up to 100 per cent of eligible project costs.

NAIDOC WEEK 2020: July 5-12

[2020 NAIDOC Local Grants](#)

These grants support activities held during NAIDOC Week 2020 (5-12 July) that celebrate Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander histories, cultures, achievements and continuing contributions to our country and society.

This grant round provides funding to organisations to contribute to the costs of local and regional NAIDOC activities across Australia.

Closing date: March 30, 2020

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

[Festivals Australia](#)

Festivals Australia provides funding to support individual art projects at festivals or significant one-off community events, such as a town's centenary celebration or opening of a major new community resource.

Festivals Australia funding will:

- provide access to a diverse range of high quality, innovative arts projects that grow audiences at festivals across regional Australia
- support partnerships and collaboration across the arts sector
- encourage community participation in arts projects at regional and remote festivals.

Closing date: March 22, 2020

[Army History Research Grants Scheme](#)

The Australian Army History Research Grants Scheme supports and encourages research into the Australian Army's history and development on operations and in peace time.

The Scheme is open to academic and non-academic researchers, with grants to a maximum of \$15,000 available for one year.

[Community Languages Multicultural Grants Stream Two](#)

The Multicultural Affairs and Citizenship Program: Community Languages Multicultural Grants Stream Two in 2019-20 aims is to build the capacity of community language schools to deliver quality language education. The Community Language Multicultural Grants aims to:

- Support the maintenance, development and acquisition of languages other than English.
- Connect young Australians to the languages and cultures of their community.
- Enhance cross-cultural awareness and respect for cultural diversity.

[Saluting Their Service Commemorative Grants Program](#)

The program aims to preserve Australia's wartime heritage and involve people around the nation in a wide range of projects and activities that highlight the service and sacrifice of Australia's service personnel in wars, conflicts and peace operations. Projects and activities should promote appreciation and understanding of the experiences of service and the roles that those who served have played in shaping the nation.

There are two categories of grants available under the program:

1. Community Grants to a maximum of \$10,000 are available for local, community-based projects and activities.
2. Major Grants between \$10,001 and \$150,000 are available for major commemorative projects and activities that are significant from a national, state, territory and/or regional perspective.

Closing date: March 31, 2020

[Indigenous Languages and Arts, Grant Round 2020](#)

The Indigenous Languages and Arts Program supports Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples to express, preserve and maintain their cultures through Indigenous languages and arts activities.

Closing date: April 6, 2020

[Empowering Business to Go Digital](#)

Grants of up to \$3 million are available to support the establishment of a non-government organisation to build and enhance small business digital capability and to address issues raised in

the [Small Business Digital Taskforce report](#). The program will run from 2019-20 to 2021-22.

[Wine Export Grants \(Re-released\)](#)

Wine Export Grants program is part of the Australian Government's \$50 million Export and Regional Wine Support Package (the \$50m Package) offered for specific wine export promotion activities aimed at supporting small and medium wine businesses to secure new distribution channels in China, Hong Kong, Macau and/or the USA.

Closing date: May 1, 2020
